Thank you for the report you made to Thames Valley Police. I am Police Constable KING 7702 - an officer with the Assessment & Investigation Unit, and I have reviewed your crime.

Your report of a crime

My conclusion

Although a suspect has been identified and you support police action, unfortunately evidential difficulties prevent us progressing the investigation further. This includes cases where the suspect has been circulated as wanted but cannot be traced, and the crime is finalised pending further action.

If we have asked you to provide further information we will review your crime again when this is received. In particular, if you have indicated that you have or know of CCTV of the incident then we will have sent you a link where you can upload this footage. This footage will subsequently be reviewed to see if an offender is identifiable. However, we will not contact you unless this results in a line of enquiry that can be pursued. In the meantime, our crime analysts will review your crime against other reported crime to help us identify crime series and patterns. This may assist us in solving your crime in the future, but we will only contact you if this leads us to identify an offender.

Thank you for taking the time to report this, by doing so it helps us make the Thames Valley a safer place for everyone in the future.
